### **A Rover 8 at Pre War Prescott - 21st July 2018**

This event, organised and hosted by The Vintage Morris Minor Register, has grown in popularity over the years as a relaxed and friendly gathering of pre-war cars, of any make, at The Bugatti Owners Club Hill Climb venue near Cheltenham. An annual event, run in aid of The RAF Charitable Trust, attracts several hundred cars with dates ranging from 1902 up to the outbreak of WW2.

Having attended previously with a friend in his MG, we decided to enter the Rover 8 in this years event. The engine was reassembled in May this year following work to hopefully rectify problems with aluminium piston "pick up" which had obviously occurred over the years. I had only managed 180 running in miles since reassembling the engine, and since it was potentially still a little tight plus given the extreme temperatures of 25-28C, 82-88F in real money, it was decided to run without bonnet sides on the day.

Prescott is a pleasant 25 mile run from our home near Stratford on Avon, on arrival participants are directed into the Paddock with spectator's cars and moderns parking in the Orchard. Included in the entry fee is one run up the hill, extra runs can be purchased at £5 a go. The hill is fully and professionally marshalled although runs are non-competitive and not timed. No crash helmets, racing suits or other nonsense is necessary and as many passengers as the car can take can be carried. All drivers and passengers though, do have to attend a safety briefing before making a run.
